Life is an amazingly complex idea. However we analyze life- physically, emotionally, psychologically, or spiritually- we quickly discover we are never quite done with it. We are forever growing into and out of different stages of life each with its own unique criteria, challenge, and benchmarks. Life even goes beyond the physical confines of earthy, biological existence. Life really does go on forever.

Life demands work. We need to fully engage in it if we are to have any modicum of peace and happiness. The work begins well before we are born in how our mothers tend to their own life while we are in their womb. Their physical and emotional wellbeing has a direct impact on how we begin our life after birth. We are immediately influenced positively and negatively by the people we live with; parents, siblings, homes, and communities. Everything within our environment that impacts our senses will determine how well or poorly we progress through the stages of life.

A child's essential personality is hardwired within the first three years of life. If we don't learn how to play nicely, share with others, and properly respect the adults in our lives by age four the chances that we will plod through our remaining years on earth awkwardly, lonely, and misunderstood are quite high. How we learn and develop in these early years will further determine how successful we will be (or not) at navigating through the temptations and depravities that certainly await us in our adult years! It is never too early to pay attention to how we live.

We will make mistakes and we have little control over the actions of the Big People in our lives as children. Thankfully we are well equipped as human beings to fix the things that weren't put together very well in our first three to five years. We can, for example, learn disciplines in later life that we never learned as children. We can teach ourselves to wait patiently and not demand immediate attention like an overly tired two year old. We can decide to be honest, or at least not to lie. We can take the risk and share of our bounty with those among us suffering from want. But this will take great effort and there is no necessary guarantee so we are better off learning these things early on. It's vital that we pay attention.

What about the New Life we are given through Jesus? Is it similar to the earthly life we are born into? Does the life of Christ have its own stages of development and critical benchmarks of learning and growth? I think so.

Last Sunday we heard Jesus speaking about the "Vine and the Branches" in the gospel.

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La vida es una idea increíblemente compleja. Independientemente de cómo analicemos la vida, física, emocional, psicológica o espiritual, descubrimos rápidamente que nunca terminamos de una vez. Estamos creciendo y saliendo de diferentes etapas de la vida, cada una con sus propios criterios, desafíos y puntos de referencia únicos. La vida incluso va más allá de los confines físicos de la existencia terrenal y biológica. La vida realmente dura para siempre.

La vida exige trabajo. Necesitamos participar plenamente en él si queremos tener un poco de paz y felicidad. El trabajo comienza mucho antes de que nazca la forma en que nuestras madres cuidan su propia vida mientras estamos en el útero. Su bienestar físico y emocional tiene un impacto directo en cómo comenzamos nuestra vida después del nacimiento. Inmediatamente, las personas con las que vivimos nos influyen positiva y negativamente; padres, hermanos, hogares y comunidades. Todo lo que impacta nuestros sentidos dentro de nuestro entorno determinará qué tan bien o mal progresamos en las etapas de la vida.

La personalidad esencial de un niño está programada dentro de los primeros tres años de vida. Si no aprendemos cómo jugar bien, compartir con los demás y respetar adecuadamente a los adultos en nuestras vidas a la edad de cuatro años, las posibilidades de que pasemos torpemente, solos e incomprendidos durante los años que nos quedan en la tierra son bastante altos. ¡Cómo aprendemos y nos desarrollamos en estos primeros años determinará aún más el éxito que tendremos (o no) en navegar a través de las tentaciones y depravaciones que ciertamente nos esperan en nuestra edad adulta! Nunca es demasiado temprano para prestar atención a cómo vivimos.

Vamos a cometer errores y tenemos poco control sobre las acciones de las Grandes Personas en nuestras vidas como niños. Afortunadamente, estamos bien equipados como seres humanos para arreglar las cosas que no se combinaron muy bien en nuestros primeros tres o cinco años. Podemos, por ejemplo, aprender disciplinas posteriores que nunca aprendimos de niños. Podemos enseñarnos a esperar pacientemente y no exigir atención inmediata como un niño de dos años excesivamente cansado. Podemos decidir ser honestos, o al menos no mentir. Podemos arriesgarnos y compartir nuestra generosidad con aquellos que sufren de necesidad. Pero esto requerirá un gran esfuerzo y no hay garantía necesaria, por lo que es mejor que aprendamos estas cosas desde el principio. Es vital que prestemos atención.

One of the truths that this image offers us is that our new life in Jesus is indeed alive and real. Our faith isn't an object. Our belief isn't confined to philosophy or a set of religious rules. Faith in Jesus is living a new life- the complete life. When we reflect on the accounts of the early Church that are proclaimed in the Acts of the Apostles it is clear that there are important stages of development which Jesus' disciples and friends had to go through before fully realizing their New Life potential. It stands to reason that we too must grow and mature through similar stages of faith development.

I can easily recognize the growing pains in my faith journey. I experience moments of doubt like Thomas. I want to run away like the two disciples on the road to Emmaus. My fear and paralysis which I experience when I need to witness to my faith mirrors that of the Apostles sitting behind closed and locked doors. On the positive side of things I've also experienced the joy and generosity shared by the first Christian communities. I've had moments of bravery and strength that St. Paul seemed to have all the time. I can see the truth that Jesus taught his friends when he told them that he was the Vine and they the branches. As long as I remain intimately tied to Jesus his life will become mine.

We are nearing the end of Easter Season. Pentecost will soon be upon us and we will reenter Ordinary Time within our Liturgical Calendar. This will be the time when our faith is both tested and when it moves through the stages of growth. Like our earthly life it is imperative that we learn certain behaviors and practice particular attitudes. Failing to embrace the wisdom of faith will have negative repercussions later in life. If we don't learn the imperatives of faith, hope, and charity early on in our New Life with Jesus we may be able to go back and relearn them but it will be more difficult. Old habits, especially bad ones, are hard to undo. It is better to practice healthy habits from the get go.

In today's Gospel Jesus tells us that we already have what we need to thrive in the New Life he gives us through Resurrection. We have His love. And if we remain in His love our New Life can't do anything but thrive. Peace.

¿Qué hay de la Nueva Vida que recibimos a través de Jesús? ¿Es similar a la vida terrenal en la que nacemos? ¿La vida de Cristo tiene sus propias etapas de desarrollo y puntos de referencia críticos de aprendizaje y crecimiento? Creo que si.

El domingo pasado escuchamos a Jesús hablar sobre la "Vid y las Ramas" en el evangelio. Una de las verdades que esta imagen nos ofrece es que nuestra nueva vida en Jesús es de hecho viva y real. Nuestra fe no es un objeto. Nuestra creencia no se limita a la filosofía o un conjunto de reglas religiosas. La fe en Jesús está viviendo una nueva vida, la vida completa. Cuando reflexionamos sobre los relatos de la Iglesia primitiva que se proclaman en los Hechos de los Apóstoles, es claro que hay etapas importantes de desarrollo que los discípulos y amigos de Jesús tuvieron que pasar antes de realizar plenamente su potencial de la Nueva Vida. Es lógico que también nosotros debemos crecer y madurar a través de etapas similares de desarrollo de la fe. Puedo reconocer fácilmente los dolores de crecimiento en mi camino de fe. Experimento momentos de duda como Thomas. Quiero huir como los dos discípulos en el camino a Emaús. Mi miedo y parálisis que experimento cuando necesito dar testimonio de mi fe refleja el de los apóstoles sentados detrás de puertas cerradas y cerradas. En el lado positivo de las cosas, también he experimentado la alegría y la generosidad compartidas por las primeras comunidades cristianas. He tenido momentos de valentía y fuerza que St. Paul parecía tener todo el tiempo. Puedo ver la verdad de que Jesús enseñó a sus amigos cuando les dijo que él era la Vid y ellos las ramas. Mientras permanezca íntimamente atado a Jesús, su vida será mía.

Estamos llegando al final de la temporada de Pascua. El Pentecostés pronto estará sobre nosotros y volveremos a ingresar al Tiempo Ordinario dentro de nuestro Calendario Litúrgico. Este será el momento cuando nuestra fe sea probada y cuando se mueva a través de las etapas de crecimiento. Al igual que nuestra vida terrenal, es imperativo que aprendamos ciertos comportamientos y practiquemos actitudes particulares. No aceptar la sabiduría de la fe tendrá repercusiones negativas más adelante en la vida. Si no aprendemos los imperativos de la fe, la esperanza y la caridad desde el comienzo de nuestra Nueva Vida con Jesús, podremos regresar y volver a aprenderlos, pero será más difícil. Los viejos hábitos, especialmente los malos, son difíciles de deshacer. Es mejor practicar hábitos saludables desde el principio.

En el Evangelio de hoy, Jesús nos dice que ya tenemos lo que necesitamos para prosperar en la Nueva Vida que nos da a través de la Resurrección. Tenemos su amor Y si permanecemos en Su amor, nuestra Nueva Vida no puede hacer otra cosa que prosperar. Paz.
