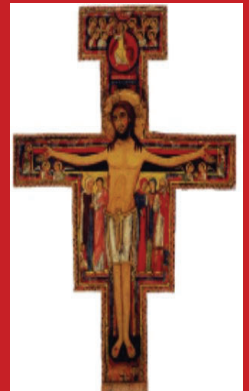

The Feast of Pentecost celebrates the coming of the fullness of the Holy Spirit- Her gifts and power- upon the Apostles and disciples of Jesus after the resurrection. Today is also the day we celebrate the birth of the Church and Her ministries, mission, and life. Pentecost also marks the end of the 50 days of the Easter Season and ushers us into liturgical season of Ordinary Time. That's a lot to unpack!

Every calendar year we spend about one third within the seasons of Lent and Easter- almost 100 days. That's a long time. Christmas Season is considerably shorter. For the Incarnation and birth of Jesus we can choose from the eight (8) days of the Octave (Dec 25th – Jan 1st), the traditional "12 Days of Christmas" ending on the Epiphany, or the longer 40 days of "Christmastide" which closes on February 2nd with the feast of the Presentation of our Lord. There is no such choice for Easter. Immediately after our 40 Days of Lent and Holy Week we embrace the 50 days of Easter. This holy stretch of time demands our attention.

Holy Scripture reminds us that the early Church needed time to pass through stages of growth into the new life of Jesus' resurrection. The scandal of the cross, the fear of authorities, the doubts of the apostles, the astonishment of the women, and the nascent proclamations of faith all took time to unfold. Pentecost brought all these events and stages together. After the Pentecost there was no turning back.

During the Easter Season we employ special rites and symbols during Sunday Mass to help us focus on meaning of Easter in our lives. We sprinkle with Holy Water and place the Pascal Candle prominently by the altar to remind us of our Baptism into the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus. We recite the words of faith first expressed by the Apostles themselves to help us remember the "bare bones" of our faith instead of the more nuanced and theologically accurate Profession of Faith of the Nicene Creed. We greet each other with Christ's Peace and sing songs of "Alleluia" with vigor and force. Hopefully all these sacred actions and ritual help us not forget who we are in Jesus Christ and Pentecost "seals the deal" with the fullness of the gifts of the Holy Spirit.

On this final day of this year's Easter Season I would like to share with you how I have experienced this holy time:

I believe in crucifixion. The scandal of the cross is not a onetime event reserved for Jesus alone. He took upon his shoulders the cross and accepted the crucifixion that our world suffers daily. Innocent people are put to death in so many ways in our society- war, street violence, poverty, terror plots, assassinations, abuse, torture, and abandonment. I know that Jesus understands our struggles intimately.

I believe in resurrection. Without reason and beyond our understanding I have witnessed people coming back from the death of addiction, brutality, depression, rejection, and infidelity. I have seen how faith in Jesus has brought people back from the death of terminal illness, shocking and unwanted strife, and the darkness of abandonment.

La fiesta de Pentecostés celebra la llegada de la plenitud del Espíritu Santo, sus dones y poder, a los apóstoles y discípulos de Jesús después de la resurrección. Hoy es también el día en que celebramos el nacimiento de la Iglesia y sus ministerios, misión y vida. Pentecostés también marca el final de los 50 días de la temporada de Pascua y nos introduce en la temporada litúrgica del Tiempo Ordinario. ¡Eso es mucho para desempacar!

Cada año calendario pasamos aproximadamente un tercio dentro de las temporadas de Cuaresma y Semana Santa, casi 100 días. Eso es un largo tiempo. La temporada de Navidad es considerablemente más corta. Para la Encarnación y el nacimiento de Jesús podemos elegir entre los ocho (8) días de la Octava (25 de diciembre - 1 de enero), los tradicionales "12 días de Navidad" que terminan en la Epifanía, o los más largos 40 días de "Navidad". que se cierra el 2 de febrero con la fiesta de la Presentación de nuestro Señor. No hay tal opción para la Pascua. Inmediatamente después de nuestros 40 días de Cuaresma y Semana Santa, inmediatamente aceptamos los 50 días de Pascua. Este tiempo sagrado de tiempo demanda nuestra atención. La Sagrada Escritura nos recuerda que la Iglesia primitiva necesitaba tiempo para pasar por etapas de crecimiento en la nueva vida de la resurrección de Jesús. El escándalo de la cruz, el temor a las autoridades, las dudas de los apóstoles, el asombro de las mujeres y las incipientes proclamaciones de fe tomaron tiempo para que se desarrollara. El Pentecostés trajo todos estos eventos y etapas juntos. Después del Pentecostés no hubo vuelta atrás.

Durante la temporada de Pascua, empleamos ritos y símbolos especiales durante la misa dominical para ayudarnos a enfocarnos en el significado de la Pascua en nuestras vidas. Rociamos con Agua Bendita durante la misa y colocamos la Vela Pascal prominentemente junto al altar para recordarnos de nuestro Bautismo en la vida, la muerte y la resurrección de Jesús. Dejamos de lado el Credo de Nicea y usamos las palabras de fe expresadas por primera vez por los mismos Apóstoles para ayudarnos a recordar los "huesos desnudos" de nuestra fe antes del desarrollo de la Profesión de Fe más matizada y teológicamente precisa. Nos saludamos con la paz de Cristo y cantamos canciones de "Aleluya" con vigor y fuerza. Afortunadamente, todas estas acciones y rituales sagrados nos ayudan a no olvidar quiénes somos en Jesucristo y Pentecostés "sella el trato" con la plenitud de los dones del Espíritu Santo. En este último día de la temporada de Pascua de este año, me gustaría compartir con ustedes cómo he vivido este tiempo santo.

Yo creo en la crucifixión. El escándalo de la cruz no es un evento de una vez reservado solo para Jesús. Él tomó sobre sus hombros la cruz y aceptó la crucifixión que nuestro mundo sufre a diario. Las personas inocentes son asesinadas de muchas maneras en nuestra sociedad: guerra, violencia callejera, pobreza, complotos terroristas, asesinatos, abuso, tortura y abandono. Sé que Jesús entiende nuestras luchas íntimamente.
