### *Prayer to Find That Which is Lost*

*"St. Anthony, perfect imitator of Jesus, who received from God the special power of restoring lost things, grant that I may find [name the item] which has been lost. At least restore to me peace and tranquility of mind, the loss of which has afflicted me even more than my material loss. To this favor, I ask another of you: that I may always remain in possession of the true good that is God. Let me rather lose all things than lose God, my supreme good. Let me never suffer the loss of my greatest treasure, eternal life with God. Amen."*

Once again we gather together as a parish to pray the novena of our patron, St. Anthony. It is a happy time for many of parishioners. Memories abound and stories are readily shared. Longtime parishioners remember times long gone, people who once graced our presence, and events that shaped our lives. More recent members of the parish easily find a new spiritual home in our beautiful church and quickly discover the quiet power of our beloved saint. He is known as the "Miracle Worker" and the "Hammer of Heretics". His preaching was legendary and was later honored as a "Doctor of the Church". We marvel when we hear the tale of St. Anthony stopping the rain storm, inviting the donkey to kneel before the Blessed Sacrament, and the fish listening to him preach. Our hearts beat a bit faster when we reflect on how the infant Jesus came to Anthony in prayer and allowed the Saint to cradle the Lord in his arms.

St. Anthony is best known for the help he provides when things go missing. We sometimes wryly pray, "Tony, Tony look around, something's lost that must be found!" but deep down we believe in the Saints' ability to intercede for us. I can't tell you the amount of times people have told me their own story where the seemingly impossible "find" occurred after invoking the help of St. Anthony. As we approach the feast day of our Patron this upcoming Wednesday, June 13th, I'd like to invite you to focus more deeply on the things we have lost and find missing in our lives and how our devotion to St. Anthony of Padua can help us all.

Yes, we all misplace our keys or lose our mobile phones at times but we can cut another key or upgrade on the mobile. Sometimes an item of great sentimental value is lost or a "one of a kind" somehow vanishes; these are harder to replace. There is nothing wrong asking St. Anthony to intercede for us in these times but there are things that are more important than material objects. What about losing your patience or your sense of humor? Have you ever lost hope in people or in humanity? I know that I miss certain friendships and care-free moments in my life. People lose their will to pray or their belief in God.

### *Oración para encontrar lo que está perdido*

*"San Antonio, el imitador perfecto de Jesús, que recibió de Dios el poder especial de restaurar cosas perdidas, concede que pueda encontrar [nombre del elemento] que se ha perdido. Al menos devuélveme paz y tranquilidad, cuya pérdida me ha afligido incluso más que mi pérdida material. A este favor, le pido a otro de ustedes: que pueda permanecer siempre en posesión del bien verdadero que es Dios. Permítanme perder todas las cosas antes que perder a Dios, mi bien supremo. Déjame nunca sufrir la pérdida de mi mayor tesoro, la vida eterna con Dios. Amén."*

Una vez más nos reunimos como una parroquia para rezar la novena de nuestro patrón, San Antonio. Es un momento feliz para muchos de los feligreses. Los recuerdos abundan y las historias se comparten fácilmente. Los feligreses de larga data recuerdan tiempos pasados, personas que una vez agradaron nuestra presencia y eventos que dieron forma a nuestras vidas. Los miembros más recientes de la parroquia encuentran fácilmente un nuevo hogar espiritual en nuestra hermosa iglesia y descubren rápidamente el poder silencioso de nuestro amado santo. Él es conocido como el "Trabajador de milagros" y el "Martillo de herejes". Su predicación fue legendaria y más tarde fue honrado como un "Doctor de la Iglesia". Nos maravillamos cuando escuchamos la historia de San Antonio parando la tormenta de lluvia, invitando al burro a arrodillarse ante el Santísimo Sacramento, y al pez que lo escucha predicando. Nuestros corazones palpitan un poco más rápido cuando reflexionamos sobre cómo el niño Jesús acudió a Antonio en oración y permitió que el Santo acunara al Señor en sus brazos.

St. Anthony es mejor conocido por la ayuda que brinda cuando las cosas se pierden. A veces, rezamos con ironía: "¡Tony, Tony mira a tu alrededor, hay algo perdido que debe ser encontrado!", Pero en el fondo creemos en la capacidad de los santos de interceder por nosotros. No puedo decirte la cantidad de veces que la gente me ha contado su propia historia donde el "hallazgo" aparentemente imposible ocurrió después de invocar la ayuda de San Antonio. Al acercarnos a la fiesta de nuestro Patrón este próximo miércoles, 13 de junio, me gustaría invitarlos a que se concentren más profundamente en las cosas que hemos perdido y encuentran perdidas en nuestras vidas y en cómo nuestra devoción a San Antonio de Padua puede ayudarnos a todos.

Sí, todos extraviamos nuestras llaves o perdimos nuestros teléfonos móviles a veces, pero podemos cortar otra clave o actualizar en el móvil. A veces se pierde un objeto de gran valor sentimental o se desaparece de alguna manera;
