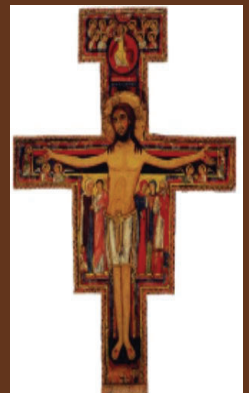

"Decide today whom you will serve... As for me and my household, we will serve the LORD."

Our Lord and God made the heavens and the earth. God brought order out of chaos. God saw to it that everything was good and that we, His only creatures made in his likeness, were deemed "very good."

With infinite love and respect God made us free. We can choose how we want to relate with one another, with the created world, and with God. We were made to be self-reflective, aware, and conscious of self. We know that we can do things. We have talents and skills to use how we please. Even when we face incredible odds and hardships our human spirit can endure, transform, and overcome. Our freedom, God given, allows us to exist unlike any other creature in the universe.

The order within which we exercise our freedom is set in time and space. There are limits, after all, but we know that God's limited, intentional, created order enhances who we are and allows us to discover an amazing array of possibilities. Over the ancient course of time we have been able to freely explore the depths of mysterious unknowns and astonishing marvels using the gifts that God endowed us with. Imagination, logic, experimentation, and daring do have all served us well. It seems as if the tools of our freedom are inexhaustible. We are forever learning and re-remembering both knowledge and truth. Our art, poetry, literature, engineering and scientific prowess are evidence of that.

Maybe the game of Chess best captures how our freedom plays out in our lives? Chess is played upon a board with clear dimensions and limits. Each individual piece has a place, function, and ability. United, the pawn, rook, knight, bishop, King and Queen move about in dazzling creativity. The moves are endless and no one game is the same yet it all happens within a simple, clear, and well thought out structure.

Curiously, God allows us to misuse our freedom; our choice. Why is it that we like the game but want to change the board or insist

"Nuestro Señor y Dios hicieron los cielos y la tierra. Dios trajo orden del caos. Dios se ocupó de que todo fuera bueno y de que nosotros, sus únicas criaturas hechas a su semejanza, se consideraran "muy buenas".

Imagination, lógica, experimentación y audacia nos han servido bien. Parece como si las herramientas de nuestra libertad fueran inagotables. Estamos aprendiendo y recordando para siempre el conocimiento y la verdad. Nuestro arte, poesía, literatura, ingeniería y destreza científica son evidencia de eso.

¿Tal vez el juego de ajedrez captura mejor cómo nuestra libertad se desarrolla en nuestras vidas? El ajedrez se juega sobre un tablero con dimensiones y límites claros. Cada pieza individual tiene un lugar, función y habilidad. United, el peón, la torre, el caballero, el alfil, el Rey y la Reina se mueven con deslumbrante creatividad. Los movimientos son infinitos y ningún juego es el mismo, pero todo sucede dentro de una estructura simple, clara y bien pensada.

Curiosamente, Dios nos permite abusar de nuestra libertad; nuestra elección. ¿Por qué es que nos gusta el juego pero queremos cambiar el tablero o insistir en que una torre no es una torre y actuar como un caballero si así lo elegimos?

that a rook is not a rook and can act like knight if we so choose? We sometimes declare not all 16 pieces on each side are good enough, necessary, or of value. In sillier moments we proclaim that chess is not chess at all but checkers. I guess our freedom can make us curious creatures. Lucky for us God affords us the help of the Spirit and her gifts of mercy, forgiveness, compassion, patience, understanding and good old common sense.

Allow me to offer a rather simple explanation of how God works. God is love and created everything from that love. Everyone and everything has purpose, meaning, and value. Goodness abounds. Life is sacred and holy. To be thoroughly enjoyed by all we are bound by certain rules. We may not fully appreciate them but they are from God and therefore good so we can trust them. Adam and Eve had one. Moses gave us ten. Jesus, thank God, shows us how to live what these rules protect and preserve and not just follow orders. Because we're free and good God trusts us to also use the gifts of the Spirit which Jesus made real and available for us.

So, as Joshua asks in our first reading, "Decide today whom you will serve." Once answered we need to answer another query; "Just how am I going to serve (insert your answer here)?" If we answered like Joshua then we can do no better than Peter and the others in today's gospel who stuck around with Jesus. We stay with Jesus because he has the word of eternal life. Peace. Fr.
