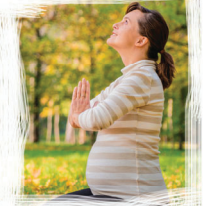

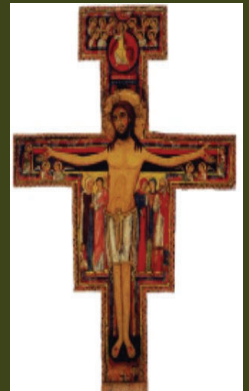

It is with sadness that we announce the death of Rev. Anthony J. Adducci. Fr. Tony often celebrated Mass at All Saints- St. Anthony Parish in the early 1990's when Fr. Ray Devereux was pastor. Fr. Adducci took an early retirement due to health conditions after faithfully serving here at our parish as well as at St. Ferdinand and St. Fabian parishes as well as chaplain for Columbus and St. Joseph Hospitals. His funeral mass was celebrated Friday October 5th at St. Alexander Church in Palos Heights and was laid to rest in the Adducci family crypt at Holy Sepulchre Cemetery in Worth, IL. We will pray for his soul.

In 1531, when the indigenous peoples of Mexico were subjugated and the practice of human sacrifice was still a recent memory, the Mother of God appeared to St. Juan Diego as a pregnant native woman, now known as Our Lady of Guadalupe.

She sent him with miraculous flowers in his cloak to tell the bishop to build a church where people could receive her Son and her loving, tender care. When St. Juan Diego opened the cloak before the bishop, an image of Our Lady was revealed that remains to this day. The chapel was quickly built, millions embraced Christianity, and the Church increased its protection of the indigenous peoples.

By embracing the mission entrusted to him, St. Juan Diego helped bring Christ's transforming love to cultures gripped by oppression and death.

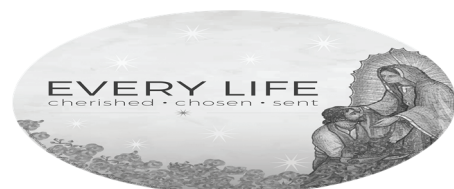
Today, we again see the dignity of human life disregarded. Unborn children are destroyed through abortion, and ill people are encouraged and assisted to take their own lives. How do we respond?

All Saints-St. Anthony Parish presents Educational Series on "The Mass"

The Catholic faith community of All Saints-St. Anthony Parish is hosting an educational program based on Bishop Robert Barron's Word on Fire film series entitled, "**The Mass.**" The series has been described on the Word on Fire website as, "*Walk through the Liturgy with Bishop Barron and you'll be transformed through insights on this most privileged and intimate encounter with our Lord Jesus Christ. See how the Mass brings us out of the fallen world and into the heavenly realm, how it resonates with a call from God and a response from His people, the Church, and most importantly, how we are intimately joined with the Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of Jesus through the Holy Eucharist. The Mass will help you understand how to fully, consciously, and actively participate in the source and summit of the Christian life.*"

Those who have seen the films acclaim that they teach subtle aspects of the Mass and encourage a deeper understanding and involvement in the most important worship Catholic Christians take part.

The entire Bridgeport Community is welcome to this program. Over eight weeks, participants will view the films and engage in a dialogue led by the Reverend Peter McQuinn. The sessions will be conducted on Wednesday evenings at 6:30PM, in the All Saints-St. Anthony school hall.

We will dedicate and bless our altar of "All Souls" during the 5pm Mass on Saturday November 3rd. Each year we invite our parishioners to bring photos of their dearly beloved and place them upon the altar for the entire month of November. We especially invite all families who experienced a death in the family in the past year to bring photo for our altar. The Mass will begin with a procession of family members carrying the photo and candle to the altar by our Blessed Mother. Please be sure to tape your contact information on the back of the frame (name & phone number) to insure that your photo returns to you at the end of the month. If you are unable to participate on November 3rd you are most welcome to bring a photo to the parish office or place the photo on the altar when you regularly come to mass.

Dedicaremos y bendeciremos nuestro altar de "Todas las almas" durante la misa de las 5 pm el sábado 3 de noviembre. Cada año invitamos a nuestros feligreses a traer fotos de sus seres queridos y colocarlos en el altar durante todo el mes de noviembre. Invitamos especialmente a todas las familias que experimentaron una muerte en la familia en el último año para traer una foto para nuestro altar. La misa comenzará con una procesión de familiares que llevarán la foto y la vela al altar de nuestra Santísima Madre. Asegúrese de pegar su información de contacto en la parte posterior del marco (nombre y número de teléfono) para asegurarse de que su foto se devuelva a usted al final del mes. Si no puede participar el 3 de noviembre, puede traer una foto a la oficina de la parroquia o colocarla en el altar cuando asiste a misa regularmente.

En 1531, cuando los indígenas de México habían sido conquistados y la práctica del sacrificio humano todavía era un recuerdo reciente, la Madre de Dios se apareció a Juan Diego como una indígena embarazada, ahora conocida como Nuestra Señora de Guadalupe.

La Virgen lo envió con flores milagrosas en su tilma para que le pidiera al obispo que construyera una iglesia donde las personas pudieran recibir a su Hijo y el amor y cuidado compasivo de ella. Cuando Juan Diego abrió la tilma ante el obispo se reveló la imagen de Nuestra Señora que vemos aún hoy. La capilla se construyó, millones se hicieron cristianos y la Iglesia aumentó su protección por los indígenas. Al abrazar la misión que se le confió, san Juan Diego ayudó a llevar el amor transformador de Cristo a culturas atrapadas en la opresión y la muerte.

Hoy nuevamente vemos el desprecio por la vida humana. Niños son abortados antes de nacer y los enfermos reciben ayuda y apoyo para quitarse la vida. ¿Cómo respondemos?

La esencia de nuestra identidad es que somos creados a imagen y semejanza de Dios y somos amados por Él. Nada puede disminuir el valor inestimable de cada vida humana. Cada persona es atesorada. Dios crea a cada persona para la unión eterna con Él y continuamente nos invita a tener una relación amorosa con Él. Cada persona es elegida.

Estamos llamados a ser embajadores del amor de Dios, tratándonos unos a otros como personas atesoradas y elegidas por él. Al hacerlo, ayudamos a construir una cultura que respete toda la vida humana. Cada persona es enviada.

Como san Juan Diego, abracemos nuestra misión diaria de ayudar a otros a encontrar el amor de Dios, que transforma y da vida.

Votive Lights, Perpetual Candles and Memorial Plaques

Many parishioners have asked what the difference is between the Votive Lights and the Perpetual Candles. **Votive lights** are the candle in the stands throughout the church that you can light weekly. Some people use the envelopes found in the liturgy racks asking us to light the candles each week for them. The name of the person or the intention for which the candle is being lit will appear in the bulletin. The cost is \$2 or \$1 per candle depending on the length of time the votive stays lit. **Perpetual candles** are the candles found by the Last Supper, Blessed Virgin Mary, St. Lucy, and St. Jude. These candles are a yearly candle. At the cost of \$150.00 per year, you can have a candle lit in honor of loved ones and a small plaque with their name will be placed in front of that candle. The **Memorial Plaques** by the Statue of St. Anthony is another way to honor loved ones. For \$250.00 you can request a plaque be placed by the statue of St. Anthony. We will have the plaque engraved with the name of your loved one or in honor of your family.
