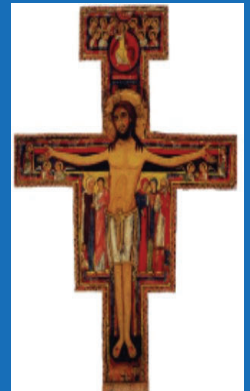

## All Saints-St. Anthony Parish presents Educational Series on "The Mass"

The Catholic faith community of All Saints-St. Anthony Parish is hosting an educational program based on Bishop Robert Barron's Word on Fire film series entitled, "**The Mass.**" The series has been described on the Word on Fire website as, "*Walk through the Liturgy with Bishop Barron and you'll be transformed through insights on this most privileged and intimate encounter with our Lord Jesus Christ. See how the Mass brings us out of the fallen world and into the heavenly realm, how it resonates with a call from God and a response from His people, the Church, and most importantly, how we are intimately joined with the Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of Jesus through the Holy Eucharist. The Mass will help you understand how to fully, consciously, and actively participate in the source and summit of the Christian life.*"

Those who have seen the films acclaim that they teach subtle aspects of the Mass and encourage a deeper understanding and involvement in the most important worship Catholic Christians take part.

The entire Bridgeport Community is welcome to this program. Over eight weeks, participants will view the films and engage in a dialogue led by the Reverend Peter McQuinn. The sessions will be conducted on Wednesday evenings at 6:30PM, in the All Saints-St. Anthony school hall.

You will also recall that we first earmarked the TTWCI funds to replace our church roof. As the campaign began a fierce storm did significant damage to the roof and we were able to make substantial repairs through an insurance claim. At that time I asked if we could use our portion of TTWCI to begin our interior church renovations and you responded positively. Now that the parish's portion of TTWCI is securely deposited in the Archdiocesan Bank I need to again ask you if we can use these funds to continue working on the interior renovations. The roof repairs made with the insurance claim remain solid and there is no evidence that the roof needs immediate attention. I would like to move forward with phase 2 of the interior renovation which will address the sanctuary area in general and the baptismal area specifically. If there is significant opinion from our parishioners who contributed to TTWCI against this plan please let me know either in writing or in person and the monies will remain with the Archdiocesan Bank to be used only for a replacement roof for the church. I will honor what the majority of donors decide. It is your pledge.

Even though \$40K sounds like a lot of money when it comes to church repair, renovation and basic upkeep it really isn't. Two weeks ago I briefly spoke to you after communion asking for your prayerful discernment in increasing your financial support of our parish. A few families were able to make gifts of several hundreds of dollars to my request. I'm grateful and I thank them. I want to encourage all of our parishioners to continue to consider offering more either in your weekly envelope or with an extra gift for the parish. Thank you.

Please remember that I will present an "end of year" financial report for FY 2017-18 and an executive budget report for the current FY on Saturday October 27<sup>th</sup> at 11am in the school hall. Everyone is welcome to attend. A snapshot of these reports will be printed in next week's bulletin.

nuestra parroquia una cosecha abundante. Me enorgullece anunciar que su esfuerzo y fe han brindado a Todos Los Santos-San Antonio con más de \$ 40,000 que podemos usar para continuar nuestro trabajo en la restauración de nuestro hermoso edificio de la iglesia. Gracias y felicitaciones por un trabajo bien hecho!

También recordará que primero destinamos los fondos de TTWCI para reemplazar el techo de nuestra iglesia. Cuando comenzó la campaña, una feroz tormenta causó daños significativos en el techo y pudimos realizar reparaciones sustanciales a través de un reclamo de seguro. En ese momento, pregunté si podíamos usar nuestra parte de TTWCI para comenzar las renovaciones de nuestra iglesia interior y usted respondió positivamente. Ahora que la porción de la parroquia de TTWCI está depositada de manera segura en el Banco Arquidiocesano, debo preguntarle nuevamente si podemos usar estos fondos para continuar trabajando en las renovaciones interiores. Las reparaciones del techo realizadas con la reclamación del seguro siguen siendo sólidas y no hay evidencia de que el techo necesite atención inmediata. Me gustaría avanzar con la fase 2 de la renovación interior, que tratará el área del santuario en general y el área bautismal específicamente. Si hay una opinión importante de nuestros feligreses que contribuyeron a TTWCI en contra de este plan, hágamelos saber por escrito o en persona y el dinero permanecerá en el Banco Arquidiocesano para usarlo solo como techo de reemplazo para la iglesia. Honraré lo que decida la mayoría de los donantes. Es tu promesa.

A pesar de que \$ 40K suena como mucho dinero cuando se trata de reparaciones, renovaciones y mantenimiento básico de la iglesia, en realidad no lo es. Hace dos semanas, les hablé brevemente después de la comunión, solicitando su discernimiento en oración para aumentar su apoyo financiero a nuestra parroquia. Algunas familias pudieron hacer regalos de varios cientos de dólares a mi pedido. Estoy agradecido y les agradezco. Quiero animar a todos nuestros feligreses a continuar considerando la posibilidad de ofrecer más en su sobre semanal o con un regalo adicional para la parroquia. Gracias.

Recuerde que presentaré un informe financiero de "fin de año" para el año fiscal 2017-18 y un informe de presupuesto ejecutivo para el año fiscal actual el sábado 27 de octubre a las 11 am en el salón de la escuela. Todos son bienvenidos a asistir. Se imprimirá una instantánea de estos informes en el boletín de la próxima semana.
