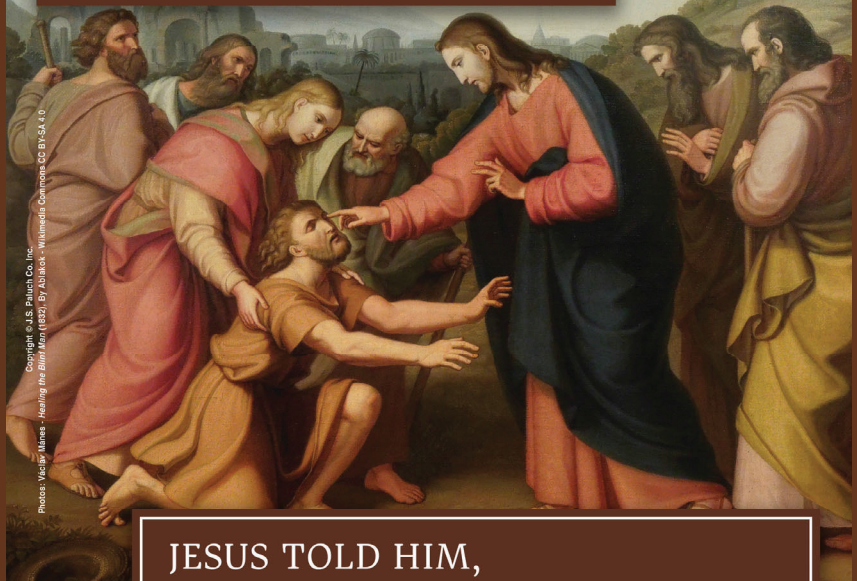

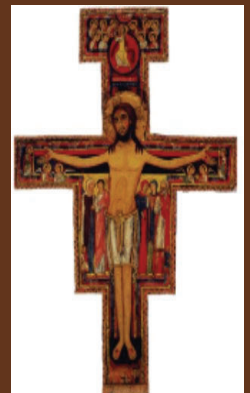

Rumors are inevitable. They are especially prevalent during times of uncertainty, transition, and change. As we near the date of Cardinal Cupich's announcement of the final Renew My Church decision for our planning area I'm not surprised to hear that our local Rumor Mill is steadily churning out untrue tidbits. I say "tidbits" because what I heard does not fall under the "whopper" or "outrageous" category but they are rumors nonetheless. I don't believe it is being vindictively passed along the grapevine but is most likely the result of miscommunication and a mishearing of something that occurred in another diocese in the United States a few years ago or the recent news concerning some Bishops.

The rumor told to me was that our Cardinal has asked for the pastors in Bridgeport, Canaryville and Chinatown to submit a letter of resignation prior to the Renew My Church (RMC) announcement. I can only imagine that the person spreading this rumor is conflating the recent news of the Chilean Bishops group resignation with our Archdiocese's RMC work. Whatever the reason this rumor remains just that, a rumor and an untruth. If you happen to hear such rumors regarding RMC please correct the person who is relating the "inside scoop" to you. What follows is the latest regarding the upcoming decision of our grouping area's reconfiguration:

- 1. The Cardinal, local vicar (Bishop Casey will be replacing Bishop Rojas but both are working closely with the Cardinal), and the RMC Committee are still working on the final decision.**
- 2. The final decision should be official November 26<sup>th</sup> when the Presbyteral Council votes on the Cardinal Cupich's proposal. This is required by Canon Law and Archdiocesan policy. The Pastors of our parishes will receive the final draft on that the Council will vote on a week prior to the 26<sup>th</sup>.**
- 3. Once the decision is finalized our area will enter into Phase III of RMC. At this point we will focus on the necessary transitions and practical adjustments needed to establish our new reality. As you can imagine there will be many moving parts involved; staffing, financing and sacramental records, building management, clergy assignments. Our Archdiocese will provide all of our parishes with the necessary support, tools, and resources for a smooth transition. This will take time.**

The time frame for reconfiguration varies from grouping to grouping. Some groupings in previous RMC decisions experienced little to no change in the day to day operations of the parishes. Others experienced significant structural change that required at least nine (9) months to implement. Still other areas will not realize the practical changes for another fiscal year.

Los rumores son inevitables. Son especialmente frecuentes en tiempos de incertidumbre, transición y cambio. A medida que nos acercamos a la fecha del anuncio del cardenal Cupich de la decisión final de Renueva Mi Iglesia para nuestra área de planificación, no me sorprende saber que nuestro local de Rumor Mill está constantemente produciendo información falsa. Digo "tidbits" porque lo que ha llegado a mis oídos no cae en la categoría "whopper" o "indignante", pero son rumores de todos modos. El último que escuché es simplemente una falsedad absoluta. No creo que se esté transmitiendo de manera vengativa a lo largo de la vid, pero es muy probable que sea el resultado de una mala comunicación y una mala audiencia de algo que ocurrió en otra diócesis en los Estados Unidos hace unos años o las noticias recientes sobre algunos Obispos.

El rumor me dijo que nuestro Cardenal ha pedido que los pastores de Bridgeport, Canaryville y Chinatown presenten una carta de renuncia antes del anuncio Renew My Church (RMC) a fines de noviembre. Solo puedo imaginar que la persona que está difundiendo este rumor está combinando las noticias recientes de la renuncia del grupo de Obispos de Chile con el trabajo Renew My Church de nuestra Arquidiócesis. Cualquiera que sea la razón, este rumor sigue siendo precisamente eso, un rumor y una mentira. Si por casualidad escuchas tales rumores sobre RMC, corrige a la persona que te está relatando la "información privilegiada". Lo que sigue es lo último sobre la próxima decisión de la reconfiguración de nuestra área de agrupación:

- El cardenal, vicario local (el obispo Casey reemplazará al obispo Rojas, pero ambos están trabajando en estrecha colaboración con el cardenal), y el Comité del CMR todavía está trabajando en la decisión final.
- La decisión final debe ser oficial el 26 de noviembre, cuando el Consejo Presbiteral vote sobre la propuesta del cardenal Cupich. Esto es requerido por la ley canónica y la política arquidiocesana. Los pastores de nuestras parroquias recibirán el borrador final sobre lo que votará el Consejo una semana antes del 26.
- Una vez que se finalice la decisión, nuestra área entrará en la Fase III del RMC. En este punto nos centraremos en las transiciones necesarias y los ajustes prácticos necesarios para establecer nuestra nueva realidad. Como puedes imaginar, habrá muchas partes móviles involucradas; Dotación de personal, registros financieros y sacramentales, administración de edificios, tareas del clero. Nuestra Arquidiócesis proporcionará a todas nuestras parroquias el apoyo, las herramientas y los recursos necesarios para una transición sin problemas. Esto tomará tiempo.
- El marco de tiempo para la reconfiguración varía de agrupación a agrupación. Algunas agrupaciones en decisiones anteriores de RMC experimentaron poco o ningún cambio en las operaciones diarias de las parroquias. Otros experimentaron cambios estructurales

We will have to wait and see how it all plays out in Bridgeport, Canaryville, and Chinatown. In closing allow me to share some personal observations based on my conversations with members of the RMC Committee and brother priests who are currently participating in Phase III of RMC or have completed the process in their area. First and foremost is that RMC leadership acknowledges their error in having us wait so long. Six months in limbo doesn't help anyone. These scheduling mishaps will not happen with current and future waves of RMC. Second, yes, it will be difficult at first but are able to adapt and adjust to meet our current realities. Most parishes discover newfound hope and vigor after a period of mourning. Thirdly and most important, we are people of faith: Catholic Christians. We believe, proclaim, and give witness to the Resurrection of our Lord, Jesus Christ. The truth of Jesus didn't end on the cross. We do not end with whatever the final outcome of RMC. Peace. Fr. Peter.
